Homeless – lacking fixed, regular and adequate housing, which includes living in shelters, parks, hotels, motels, public spaces, camping grounds, abandoned buildings, or cars, or temporarily living with other people because you had nowhere else to go.

Unable to Obtain Documentation Verifying Homeless

Attach a letter explaining your situation, if you have other circumstances that qualify you as an unaccompanied homeless youth or you are at risk of homelessness and are not able to get the documentation from one of the above officials. Attach any information you may have in support of your statements. *Please complete and submit page 2, Homeless Youth Certification Request, along with any supporting documentation, with this Verification Form.* A student who chooses to leave their parents' home will need to demonstrate that they were at risk of harm if they continued to live with their parents. More Information Regarding Unaccompanied Homeless Youth

Who are Unaccompanied Homeless Youth?

Unaccompanied homeless youth are young people who lack safe, stable housing and who are not in the care of a parent or guardian. They may have run away from home or been forced to leave by their parents. Unaccompanied youth live in a variety of temporary situations, including shelters, the homes of friends or relatives, cars, campgrounds, public parks, abandoned buildings, motels, and bus or train stations.

Who are McKinney-Vento School District Liaisons?

Under subtitle VII-B of the McKinney Vento Homeless Assistance Act, every school district is required to designate a liaison for students experiencing homelessness. Homeless liaisons have a number of legal responsibilities under the Act, including identifying youth who meet the definition of homeless and are unaccompanied.
